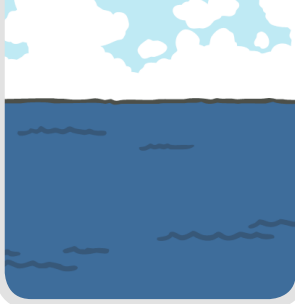

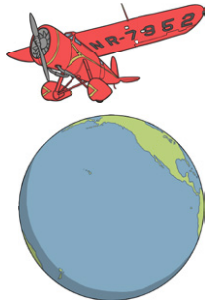

In July 1937, Amelia Earhart went missing over Howland Island as she tried to fly around the world.

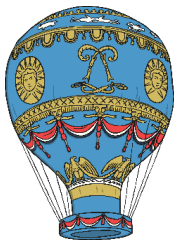
A lighthouse was built there to remember her.

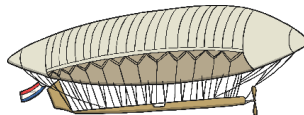

Who Was Amelia Earhart?

Throughout history, people have invented and built machines that allow people to fly. Some brave adventurers have then taken on incredible challenges in these machines, flying further, faster or higher than ever before. Read on to find out about one such person.

Amelia Jane Earhart is one of America's most well-known and adventurous aviators.



She is famous because she was the first female pilot to fly alone across the Atlantic Ocean.



She was born in Atchison, Kansas, USA on 24th July 1897.



She went missing on 2nd July 1937, somewhere over the Pacific Ocean. She was attempting to fly solo around the whole world.

Her Childhood

Amelia lived with her father, mother and younger sister, Grace Muriel. She enjoyed adventures and was quite a tomboy. She would climb trees, hunt rats and ride her sledge down hills!



The Earhart sisters were allowed to wear bloomers, which the other girls in the neighbourhood were not allowed to do.

They enjoyed the freedom that they did not have when wearing dresses.

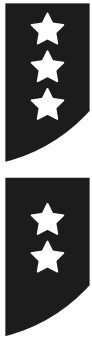


As well as a love of adventure, Amelia Earhart was also very interested in successful women who worked in jobs usually associated with men.



After senior school, she worked as a nurse's aide in Canada, looking after wounded soldiers in the First World War. She later became a social worker.

Her Big Adventure


Amelia Earhart was given her first plane ride on 28th December, 1920.

By the time I had got two or three hundred feet off the ground, I knew I had to fly.



She had her first flying lesson when she was 23 years old.

In July 1921, she bought her first plane. It was bright yellow and she named it "The Canary".



In October 1922, she broke the women's altitude record.

In May 1923, she got her pilot's license – she was only the 16th woman in the world to receive one.


In June 1928, she became the first woman to fly across the Atlantic, alongside two other male pilots.

In May 1932, she became the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic.

A Sad End



On 20th May 1937, Amelia and her navigator, Fred Noonan, left Oakland, USA for her biggest adventure, to fly all the way around the world.



This would be a journey of 29 000 miles and was to end at the same place it started.

On 2nd July 1937, Amelia and Fred Noonan tried to make the next flight of their trip, from New Guinea to Howland Island in the Pacific.

However, the weather was bad, with cloud and rain showers. The island they were hoping to land on, Howland Island, was extremely small, so two American ships were ordered to burn every light to act as markers to guide them in.

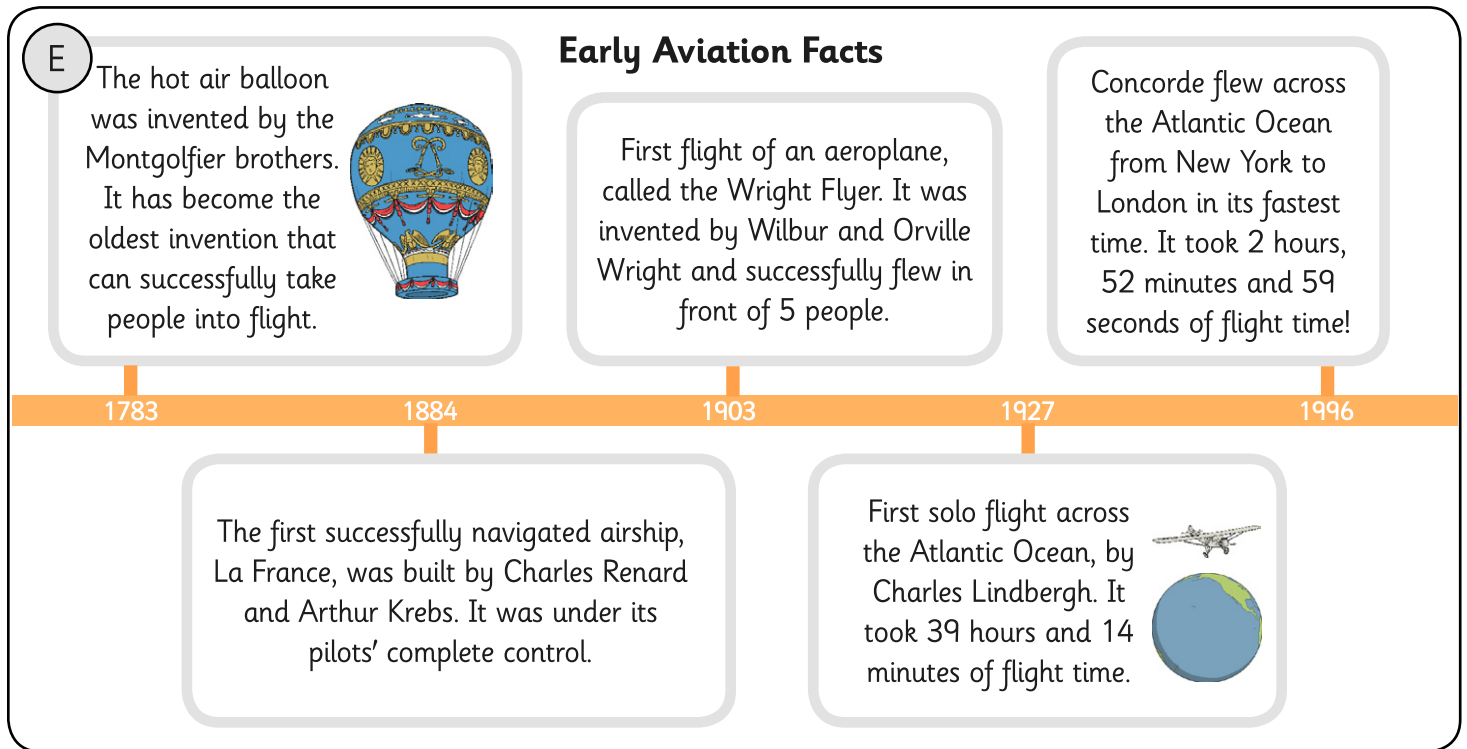


A lighthouse was built on Howland Island in her memory.

Sadly, due to poor weather and low fuel, Amelia and Fred never made it to Howland Island.

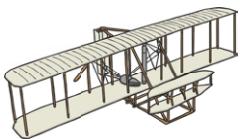

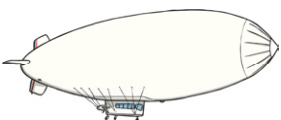
