

# Animal Groups

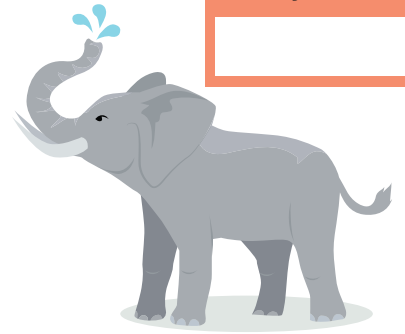
# STAGE 1

Humans like to live in groups. Sometimes we call this a crowd. Lots of animals live in groups. Groups of animals have lots of different fun names. These are called **collective nouns**.



A group of gorillas is called a **band** or a **troop**.

E: Why are the collective nouns highlighted?



You might find a **herd** or **memory** of elephants.



Groups of parrots are very noisy. They are called a **pandemonium**.

Lions live in **packs**. There is normally only one adult male.

Lots of big hippos together are called a **bloat**!
